Contest Lights Up the Community 🖈

Our **Third Annual Holiday Lights Tour & Contest** was another successful COVID-safe event. This year we had 24 homeowners in Westchester and Playa del Rey participating in the Tour.

Tour-goers selected the home of David and Nancy Voss at 370 Fowling Street, Playa del Rey as the **Fan Favorite**. The first runner-up was the Greenwald home at 6443 Riggs Place, and the second runner-up was the Jackson home at 7807 Cowan Avenue, both in Westchester.

Last year's Fan Favorite, the Westchester home of Jon and Tina Vanderjagt on West 78th Street, and the 2020 winning homes also were part of the Tour, but did not participate in the Contest.

We had seven generous sponsors for this year's Tour. Our **Diamond sponsors** were the Stephanie Younger Group, Playa Venice Sunrise Rotary, Jane St.John of ReMax Realty, Law Offices of Edgar Saenz, and the Woman's Club of Playa del Rey. Our **Jewel sponsors** were the Suarez Team, Otis College of Art & Design, and the *HomeTown News*. In addition, other financial support was received from Susan Zolla of the Inn at Playa del Rey.

With nearly **600 tickets sold**, the sponsors, and numerous additional donations, the Tour earned the Guild more than **\$15,000**, after expenses for the preparation of lighted signs for the homes on the Tour and prizes for the winners. Tour-goers paid \$10 for tickets, which gave them a list of addresses, maps of the homes and a chance to vote for their favorite.

We do not know yet whether we will host a Holiday Home Tour on November 5, 2023, or whether we will continue hosting the Holiday Lights Tour & Contest next December. Quick and Easy Recipe

Candy's Sun Dried Tomato Dip with Brie Cheese and Crackers

Ingredients:

- 2 jars of sun dried tomatoes with olive oil (purchase at Trader Joe's)
- 2 or 3 pieces of garlic from a whole garlic clove (peel the skin off)
- 8 to 10 leaves of fresh basil
- A large piece of Brie cheese (soften to room temperature before serving)
- Crackers

Empty the 2 jars of sun dried tomatoes with olive oil, pieces of garlic and fresh basil leaves in a blender and pulse until everything is mixed. The mixture will be thick. You can make this ahead and store the mixture in the 2 empty jars or other containers in the refrigerator.

When you are ready to serve the dip, place the Brie cheese on a serving plate and spoon the dip over the cheese or you can serve the dip separately in a small bowl. Place the crackers all around the cheese with a serving knife. This is a delicious appetizer.
