#### **Quick and Easy Recipe**


Tina's Zucchini Noodles with Basil Pesto

#### **Ingredients:**

- 5 medium zucchini 2 oz. Parmesan cheese cut into chunks Pinch of salt and pepper
- Clove of garlic (use more to taste)
- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup olive oil
- 1 cup fresh basil leaves
- Pinch of red hot chili pepper (optional)

Using a spiralizer or a mandolin, make noodles out of zucchini. In a food processor, add cheese, garlic, pinch of salt and pepper and chili pepper (optional). Pulse until fine. Add basil leaves and pulse. Pour olive oil into the feed tube and slowly pulse.

Place zucchini noodles in a large serving bowl and add pesto and toss until noodles are coated. If pesto is too thick, add a little water or olive oil. Serve immediately. Makes 6 servings.

## Diamond Celebration

Board members of **Airport Marina Counseling Service** and the **Westchester Mental Health Guild** celebrated our joint history of 60 years of providing mental health services in the community, on June 21, 2022, with more than 50 supporters toasting this impressive history of counseling services provided since 1962.

**Rick and Myra Kriwanek** hosted the event on the first day of summer in their lovely Westchester backyard. Founder **Mary Ellen Cassman**, who is now 99 years old, was recognized for her determination in starting the organization at a time when mental health counseling was controversial. The Guild presented Mary Ellen with a diamond pendant in recognition of this diamond anniversary.

Current AMCS Chief Executive Office Eden Garcia-Balis, AMCS Board President Nancy Edwards, and Guild President Janie Guthrie all thanked the board members and community sponsors who attended for their unwavering support over the years in raising funds to support the clinic. The Guild presented a **\$5.000 check to AMCS** from tributes and memorials from Guild members, one of the countless ways the Guild has provided funds for the cause. Although precise records for the 60 years are unavailable, in recent years, the Guild has calculated that it has raised more than a million dollars for AMCS. As a non-profit fundraising organization, the Guild works side-by-side with AMCS, which provides affordable mental health counseling and trains mental health therapists.

## **Quick and Easy Recipe**

#### Mary's Peach Crumble Pie

Line a pie dish (greased) with 7 peaches, sliced, either peeled or not. Combine 3 Tbs. of soft butter with 1 cup of flour and 1 cup of brown sugar. Combine until crumbly. Spread over peaches and bake at 350 degrees for 45 minutes. It is delicious with a scoop of vanilla ice cream. **Makes 6 servings**




